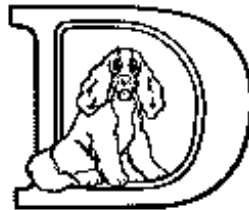

A Day in the Life of a Pioneer

A day in the life of a pioneer featured a lot of hard work. We turn on a tap for water; the pioneer had to fetch water by pail from a spring, creek or well, carry it home and then dip out what was needed. There was no five minute porridge; the oatmeal would have soaked in water all night and then boiled for half an hour in the morning, either hanging over a fire in the fireplace or on the wood stove.

You didn't phone your neighbour but either went yourself or sent a note with a child who usually got a cookie or muffin to eat while waiting for a reply. The men had to put in a full day of work to grow crops, tend farm animals, cut trees for firewood and for building and repairing. The women had to wash clothes by hand, bake and cook food, look after younger children and find time to sew and knit, often after spinning the wool.

Most wounds and illnesses were treated at home using remedies that could be made from locally grown plants and other materials. Toiletries and salves were made on the premises.

We continue the working one-room school where today's children can briefly taste the experience their ancestors enjoyed/endured in the 1800s.

Music was usually provided by whatever musicians were available in the area. By the early nineteen hundreds, phonograph records became available. Again we present a continuous outpouring of authentic recordings of the day thanks to Library and Archives Canada who have made these recordings available.

Many of the recreational crafts of today were the necessities of life back when great grandma was a child. Local craftspeople demonstrate how to survive and thrive in pioneer times.

See the tools of your forefathers used in order to build and eat. There wasn't much time for recreation but on special occasions, the pioneers could kick up their heels. Hear the music of those days. Many people only went to town a few times a year but see what was available for them at the General Store and other establishments.
