Rules and Regulations

1. None but members of the Society will be allowed to compete for prizes.
2. **Membership fee for 2010 will be \$12.00 and includes a 1 day admission to the fair grounds. Livestock exhibitors are allowed one helper's admission with their membership pass. There is no admission charged on Thursday.**
3. In all articles of manufacture, grain, seeds and produce, no person shall enter in the same class more than one article of each kind, which must be their own manufacture or growth.
4. All animals and articles must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, and all vegetables to be grown in 2010. All fruits, etc. must be correctly named on each exhibit.
5. The judges shall have the power to decide whether the animal or article is worthy of a prize. Where there is little or no competition, the judges are to decide what prizes are warranted, if any, but cannot change entries from one class to another.
6. **Exhibit Hall Entries will be accepted 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 1 and Thursday, September 2, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Judging of Hall exhibits will commence at 2:00 p.m. Thursday. The Hall will be open for viewing by visitors Friday, Saturday & Sunday. The Exhibit Hall will close Sunday at 5:00 p.m. to prepare for removal of exhibits at 5:15 p.m. At this time, and for security reasons, all exhibitors must present their yellow membership paper to prove their membership and allow entrance to the hall. One helper only is allowed, if necessary. Exhibits may not be removed prior to this time. All exhibitors have the responsibility to pick up their goods in a timely fashion. The Exhibit Hall will close at 6:00 p.m.**

Important Notice to Photographic Exhibitors

Due to the large volume of photographic exhibits received and the limitations of display space, we will only accept advance entries as follows:

In Person: On Saturday, August 14, 2010, at the Secretary's Office in the Fairgrounds, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. only.

Judging will take place on August 20, 2010

7. Livestock exhibits must be on the grounds by 8:30 a.m. of the second day of the exhibition, Saturday, September 4. No animal may be removed without special permission until close of show.
8. Only entries in livestock may compete for more than one prize.
9. Exhibitors of thoroughbred animals shall produce pedigrees to the satisfaction of judges or they will not be entitled to a prize.
10. Calves to be judged according to age (to be indicated on ticket). Sheep must be unloaded.

11. All animals exhibited must have a suitable halter. Animals not under control shall not be allowed to compete.
12. **Exhibitors showing only in Parade Classes do not need to be members of the Society. Please ensure that the Fair Board secretary has a record of your name and address.**
13. Limit two entries per section per membership for all saddle horses.
14. The Society will not be responsible for any accident on the track or the Grounds.
15. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judges.
16. If any dispute occurs, the treasurer will hold premiums until dispute is settled.
17. No premiums will be paid on the day of the show. Membership for 2011 will be deducted from exhibitors taking in excess of \$20.00.
18. **SPECIAL NOTE -- Prize winners are requested to send a list of prizes claimed to the secretary no later than September 23, 2010**
19. All exhibits shown at owner's risk against loss or damage.
20. No exhibitor or spectator shall be allowed to show disrespect or use abusive language to any official. Violators may be removed from the fair grounds.
21. **SPECIAL NOTE -- The Society will NOT retain 10% of prize money.**
22. A percentage only of prize money will be paid if directors consider the receipts insufficient to pay in full.
23. The Society reserves the right to interpret its own rules and regulations. Should any dispute or question arise not provided for in these rules and regulations, the decision of the Board of Directors will be final.
24. Parties violating any of these rules will be subject to expulsion from the Society and forfeit all prizes they may be entitled to.

Tips for Exhibitors

1. **To avoid line-ups and delays**, please make every effort to pre-register your exhibits with the fair board secretary by Wednesday, September 1st.

2. Please note entry tags will not be mailed back for any entries received after Monday, August 30, 2010. These entry tags will be held for pick-up at the exhibit hall when entries are brought in.
3. To avoid delays and confusion when you bring in your exhibits, please try to prepare your entry tags before arriving with your exhibits, listing the Class and Section Numbers along with your name and address. Don't forget to sign your entry tags.
4. You may need pins, tape, string, paper plates, etc. to properly display your exhibits. Bring everything you will need with you!
5. Our busiest time for receiving entries is Thursday, between 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Try to come in on Wednesday evening or early Thursday morning and you will avoid delays and line-ups.
6. If you have difficulty determining the Class and/or Section Numbers to use for your entries, don't hesitate to consult with the exhibit hall staff. They will do everything possible to help you.
