REGULATIONS:

1. Exhibitors must be members of the Kinmount Agricultural Society. Membership fee is \$12.00 and must accompany your entry form.
Membership pass allows exhibitor and one helper admittance to the grounds
2. Judging will commence at 10:30 a.m., Sunday, September 5, 2010.
3. Does must be tattooed and papers available for inspection. Animals must be registered in the owner's name. A tattoo check will be conducted prior to the commencement of the show.
4. There will be no limit on the number of animals entered per class. Exhibitors are eligible for only 2 prizes per class.
5. Milkers must be milked dry 12 hours before judging begins. Goats with hard udders (distended) may be disqualified at the discretion of the judge.
6. Goats which are not in good health may be disqualified by the veterinarian.
7. Animals with horns will be disqualified.
8. Animals must be on the grounds not later than 9:45 a.m. for veterinary inspection.
9. Entry forms may be mailed to Leah Parker, RR #1, Kinmount, ON, K0M 2A0.
10. Any abuse, verbal or otherwise, of veterinary personnel, judge or show staff will result in an exhibitor being struck from the show and asked to leave the premises.

1. Bull calf, born on or after January 1, 2010, minimum of six months of age on day of judging.
2. Bull yearling, born April 1, 2009 - December 31, 2009.
3. Bull Yearling, born January 1, 2009 - March 31, 2009.
4. Bull born January 1, 2007 - December 31, 2009.
5. Female Calf, born on or after January 1, 2010, minimum of six months of age on day of judging.
6. Female heifer, born April 1, 2009 - December 31, 2009
7. Female heifer, born January 1, 2009 - March 31, 2009
8. Female, born January 1, 2008 - December 31, 2008 with her own 2010 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot. (must be shown as a unit)
9. Female, born prior to January 1, 2008 with her own 2010 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot (must be shown as a unit)
10. Breeder's Herd. A group of 4 animals, bred by exhibitor, both sexes

represented, must be exhibited in previous classes. At least one animal owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.

**Rules: Please read carefully as rules will be adhered to.
Take note - AC, AOC, AV & AOV entries not named on entry forms
will not be accepted. Please specify AOC.**

1. Anyone other than officials of the show found opening a cage that contains birds other than their own will have their birds removed from the show and will forfeit all prize monies.
2. Only healthy birds will be accepted in the building. Those showing signs of sickness will be removed from the exhibit hall by the Director in charge. Birds showing signs of sickness will not be judged. **IT IS TO THE BENEFIT OF ALL EXHIBITORS THAT ONLY HEALTHY BIRDS BE EXHIBITED.**
3. Entries close August 20, 2010 -- **NO EXCEPTIONS. All entries must include your membership number or the entries will be returned.**
4. Year 2011 membership fee will be deducted from prize money in excess of \$20.00 (juniors excepted).
5. All exhibitors (excepting juniors) must hold current membership in the Kinmount Agricultural Society. Retained membership fees for 2011 will be \$12.00.
6. All exhibitors must be approved by the Poultry Committee or the Fair Board Executive. The committee reserves the right to refuse or limit entries.
7. Exhibits are limited to 2 entries per section; i.e. 2 cocks, 2 hens, 2 cockerels and 2 pullets for chickens - this includes classes 48, 56, & 61, regardless of breed; 2 drakes and 2 ducks for ducks; 2 ganders and 2 geese for geese. And 2 bucks and 2 does for rabbits. Total entries per household/family limited to 75.
8. Entries limited to the first 350 birds.
9. **ANY BIRD, CONSIDERED BY THE JUDGES TO BE UNWORTHY OF FIRST PLACE, REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF BIRDS ENTERED, WILL NO RECEIVE A FIRST PLACE STANDING.**
10. **THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL**
11. Poultry must be at the exhibits building not later than 9:30 a.m., Friday, Sept 3, and must remain on display until 4:00 p.m., Sunday, Sept 5, 2010. Anyone removing their birds before this date and time without expressed permission of the directors of the show will forfeit their prize money. Exhibits may be brought in between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m., Thursday evening, Sept 2 and after 8:00 a.m. Friday, Sept 3, 2010. Judging begins at 10:00 a.m. sharp on Friday Sept 3.
12. Barn will be closed while judging is in progress.
13. At the close of the show, exhibitors, when removing birds, are to leave tags in place until their birds have been removed. They are then requested to remove **ALL** tags. It is a great help to those of us cleaning up afterwards if you dispose of your own tags.

ENTRY FEE: \$1.00 per exhibit.**

Food and water will be provided while birds are on exhibit, excepting those brought in on Thursday evening. You are requested to feed and water your own birds at that time.

JUNIOR CLASSES: Persons 16 years of age and under at fair date.

JUNIORS PLEASE NOTE: Due to time conflicts with 4H Clubs, juniors are not required to be present during judging. Judging of junior exhibits will be according to 4H rules, i.e. the point system.

1. Junior exhibitors must carry in and remove their own birds.
2. Only 2 entries total per person. No entry fee.
3. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor.
4. All exhibitors **must correctly name** their entries and colour on the entry form and section numbers are required.
5. Age **must** be shown on the entry form.
6. Junior entries will also be judged in senior classes.
7. Rules above marked with an asterisk* apply also to juniors.

JUNIOR PRIZES

A trophy will be given for the Champion Junior. First, Second and Third Place Ribbons. Prize money same as for seniors.

A prize of \$10.00 will be given for the Junior Champion Duck & Junior Champion Goose by Glen Paine of Kerwood, Ontario.
